How Do I????

As our church by God's grace continues to grow, many times new disciples (as well as longtime disciples) have problems knowing how to contact the church and the church leaders when the need arises. Please govern yourself by the following:



DEATH: Family members of SLBC disciples should contact the Church Office with the news of death as soon as possible. A service of worship and repast will be planned according to the church guidelines for disciples of our congregation. For the relatives of SLBC disciples, an appropriate expression/acknowledgement will be sent as an expression of sympathy. When notifying the church of a relative's death, please have all of the vital information.



WEDDINGS: Couples interested in getting married at SLBC must be SLBC disciples (either prospective bride or groom). The first step is to contact the Church Office to see if the date is available. Couples will then receive a wedding package in the mail which details all of the requirements, fees, etc. Couples being married at SLBC must attend premarital classes. Weddings for persons who are not SLBC disciples are occasionally permitted according to the church's calendar.



HOSPITALIZATION: When a disciple of SLBC is hospitalized our church desires to express our care and concern. If you are unable to call yourself, please have a family member or a hospital staff person contact the Church Office.



APPOINTMENTS: Our Pastor and Staff are available to meet with SLBC disciples BY APPOINTMENT. The office is open daily, but please do not just “show up” and expect to be seen. Please call the office to schedule an appointment. Also remember that Sunday IS NOT the day to schedule an appointment, to discuss or engage in business unrelated to worship.



INFANT DEDICATIONS: Infant dedications are performed as an opportunity for parents to express thanks to God for allowing them to be parents and to consecrate the life of the child and family to Christ and the church. To inquire about a specific date, please call the Church Office.

Welcome To Our Pulpit

Rev. Dr. Vernon C. Walton



Church and Community have always been the staples of the ministry of Dr. Vernon C. Walton. Dr. Walton is a native of Jersey City, New Jersey. Today he serves as Senior Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Vienna, Virginia, Walton's primary mission is to "make a difference in our community and be a light of hope for the World."

Walton was licensed to preach in 1989 and ordained in 1993 by the Salem Baptist Church, Jersey City, under the Pastorate of the late Reverend Dr. H. Hudson Bobbitt. Dr. Walton earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology & Criminal Justice from Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia (1993) and his Master of Divinity Degree from New York Theological Seminary (1997) and a Doctorate of Ministry Degree in Preaching and Leadership from United Theological Seminary of Dayton, Ohio in December 2003.

Dr. Walton has previously served as Minister of Youth at the St. James Baptist Church of Milford, Virginia. He later joined Mount Olive Baptist Church of Hackensack, New Jersey as Youth Pastor and later called to serve as Assistant Pastor under the leadership of the Reverend Gregory J. Jackson. In 1998, Rev. Walton became the fourth Senior Pastor of Mount Calvary Baptist Church of Englewood, New Jersey. Under his leadership, Mount Calvary expanded its witness, through membership growth, multiple staff development, addition of multiple worship services and the formation of Calvary Cares Community Development Corporation which ministered to the needs of the entire community.

With a passion for community, Dr. Walton has previously served as a Councilman for the City of Englewood (2004-2006). He was also elected as the first African American Freeholder for the County of Bergen (2008). In addition, he was a founding Board Member for the 1st Federal Credit Union and Past Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Ramapo College, Mahwah, New Jersey.

In February 2014, the First Baptist Church of Vienna, Virginia was led to call Dr. Walton as its 9th Senior Pastor in their 146 year history. His charismatic, energetic, and innovative leadership is leading this 1100 member congregation into a season where they are "Empowered by the Past and Excited About the Future." In addition, Dr. Walton serves the denomination as a board member of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., where Dr. Jerry Young as president.

Dr. Walton recently released his first book, *Life Lessons: Living, Learning & Trusting God*. Walton has been honored by two national publications: *The Network Journal* as one of the "40 under forty" Class of 2010 and *The African American Pulpit Journal* as one of the "Twenty to Watch under Forty" Spring 2005. Walton is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Incorporated and loves his role as preacher and teacher.

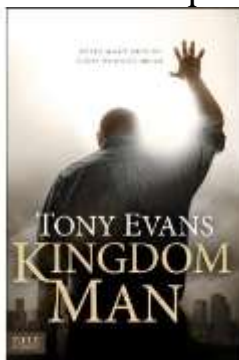

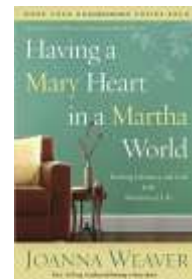

Hurricanes Harvey and Irma Relief



Over the last two weeks people in Houston and the Southeast region of Texas (Beaumont, Port Athur, etc.), Florida, Puerto Rico, and the Caribbean have been devastated as a result of hurricanes, and Mexico has been devastated as a result of earthquakes. How Should This Sermon Influence My Christian Growth and Service?:

Special Points to Consider:

Our Response To Today's Message

As we are being challenged to be HEARERS and DOERS of the Word, we are being called to a serious response to each message/ sermon that we hear. The following pattern has been designed to encourage each of us to hear the WORD and LIVE IT!!!

First, READ

the sermon text slowly, meditatively and expectantly three times. Allow God's Word to be your primary focus. As you read, listen for God's message to His people both then and for you now. Ask yourself, "What truth is God calling me to learn and live out today?" (5 minutes)

Second, REFLECT

in the scripture. Record your observations. Note those things which stand out, pique your interest or make you wonder. Pay attention to the names of people, places, special events, sequences, repetition, patterns, etc. Note the use of verbs and verb tenses. (10 minutes)

Next, RETREAT

in prayer. Take two or three minutes to share your prayer concerns with God. Then devote the balance of your prayer time to silently and expectantly listening for God's words to you. Record both your prayers and God's response.

Finally, RESPOND

with action! God's answer to prayer almost always calls for a corresponding act on the part of those to whom God has given His Word. As the Lord addresses the prayers you have set before Him, ask yourself, "What is the one thing I will do in light of what I have discovered today?" Record this and commit to carrying it out today.
