My Dear Loved Ones,

On last Sunday, I shared the following quote with you, "Black History Month must be more than just a month of remembrance: it should be a tribute to our history and reminder of the work that lies in the month and years ahead."

In light of the results of the 2016 presidential election and all of the consequences that are now becoming reality in light of the election, these words speak to us in a clear and challenging way. We must not allow ourselves to become lulled into a romanticized picture of the history of African American people in this country. Indeed, "we have come over a path that with tears has been watered...." Our history in this country has been filled with pain, obstacles, and oppression, but in the face of it and through it we survived and thrived! Indeed we should and we must celebrate our victorious evolution in the land of America, against the odds levied at us.

We must also seek strength to empower us to face the many challenges that now lie before us and those that are yet to come. It is glaringly apparent that the current presidential administration is determined to roll back the clock and dismantle the rights that should be afforded to every American. This fact must implore us to work vigilantly as we press ahead.

The church, has a responsibility to be the "light of the world and the salt of the earth." Embedded in this responsibility is the necessity to be an advocate for justice, equality, and parity in our world. We must speak out for those who have no voice, and speak against those who seek to oppress, enslave, and marginalize. May we as a local congregation take seriously our biblical role and responsibility, and may we engage in it in practical ways.

Today in United Worship, we celebrate Heritage Sunday and we welcome Brother Walter Fields as our Guest Messenger. At 4:00pm we will celebrate Baptism and Communion in conjunction with the celebration of the service of our Deacons, Deaconess, and Trustees.

May all that we do in today's worship inspire us to be a more effective congregation of Christian disciples, whose goal it is to change the world!

How Do I????

As our church by God's grace continues to grow, many times new disciples (as well as longtime disciples) have problems knowing how to contact the church and the church leaders when the need arises. Please govern yourself by the following:

DEATH: Family members of SLBC disciples should contact the Church Office with the news of death as soon as possible. A service of worship and repast will be planned according to the church guidelines for disciples of our congregation. For the relatives of SLBC disciples, an appropriate expression/acknowledgement will be sent as an expression of sympathy. When notifying the church of a relative's death, please have all of the vital information.

WEDDINGS: Couples interested in getting married at SLBC must be SLBC disciples (either prospective bride or groom). The first step is to contact the Church Office to see if the date is available. Couples will then receive a wedding package in the mail which details all of the requirements, fees, etc. Couples being married at SLBC must attend premarital classes. Weddings for persons who are not SLBC disciples are occasionally permitted according to the church's calendar.

HOSPITALIZATION: When a disciple of SLBC is hospitalized our church desires to express our care and concern. If you are unable to call yourself, please have a family member or a hospital staff person contact the Church Office.

APPOINTMENTS: Our Pastor and Staff are available to meet with SLBC disciples BY APPOINTMENT. The office is open daily, but please do not just "show up" and expect to be seen. Please call the office to schedule an appointment. Also remember that Sunday IS NOT the day to schedule an appointment, to discuss or engage in business unrelated to worship.

INFANT DEDICATIONS: Infant dedications are performed as an opportunity for parents to express thanks to God for allowing them to be parents and to consecrate the life of the child and family to Christ and the church. To inquire about a specific date, please call the Church Office.

Stewardship Reflection

THE PRACTICAL BASIS FOR TITHING

For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself for the battle." (1st Corinthians 14:8)

The Minister

All of us pastors, full-time, share one commonality. Time. Whatever time is given to the ministry, to pastorship, must be well spent not only for the benefit of the people God has given us, but also for the sake of our personal integrity. How can I sleep at night when I know in my heart my work for the King of Kings has been sloppy and dishonest? We preach all the time – "when a kind and pleading Jesus becomes a stern and severe judge, I want to hear Him say 'well done'!"

How do we use our time? On what is our energy expended? What kingdom-products are born out of the majority of our efforts? It is not my wish to indict any of my brothers and sisters but I do sense that there is a need to look closely at where much of the expenditure of energy is lost for the kingdom. I would risk the guess that more than half of whatever time we spend in ministry at the moment is directly and indirectly related to the matter of money matters. I do not mean taking the offering and giving direction about prudent disbursement. I mean the politics of money in the church. If your church is traditional in its fund-raising, the political aspect of fund-raising in your church is so pervasive and subtle, that frequently our ministry has been diluted to a ministry of fund-raising. *And that's not our job!*

Let me take a few moments to analyze the politics of pastorship in a non-tithing church. In this day and time, the costs for the delivery of goods and services are such that a modest institution takes a sizeable amount of dollars to keep it running. Brick and mortar costs, maintenance, telephone, printing, custodial service, secretarial help, fuel oil, electricity, air conditioning. I have not mentioned pastor's salary, anniversary, love offerings and the like. Whether your congregation is 100 or 200 or 500 or 1000 or 2000, the energy required to fuel your operation with dollars in a non-tithing church is enormous. Not only is that expenditure of energy enormous, it is disproportionate to the other tasks of the ministry.

In a non-tithing church, where fund-raising of every variety is the rule rather than the exception, much of the pastor's time and energy and ingenuity are utilized "picking the right people." Then you have the added task of spiritually "wining and dining them," stroking them the right way so that they will do the dirty work for you under the guise of being a "church leader." Depending upon the demands of the budget, special days and events must be staggered in order that one does not compete with the other in any disastrous manner lest king-pin "A" and queen-pin "B" have a confrontation over preeminence. Too many churches are wrecked over who has claim on an annual day for fund-raising. God forbid that one of these chief fund raisers gets out of line and joins the opposition. Then old Rev.'s got to get busy and start a back-fire to head off the opposition at the pass so it doesn't kill the pastor's anniversary effort. This is the beginning of pastoral blackmail. You pull some strings, then you owe somebody. A crucial decision comes along in church life and the "games" we have been playing catch up with us and the real work of the kingdom goes by the boards.

Let us say for the sake of argument that because you are not like other pastors you have escaped the entrapment described above. There are other options in a non-tithing church. Two are characterized by excess. One is Napoleonic. The demands of the budget operation are such that the pastor takes over with his henchmen. *My* chairman, *my* treasurer, *my* trustees *my* board and church becomes (for a while) our personal fiefdom. People are funny about money. Sooner or later, you may have a civil war on your hands that you never intended to have. The other excess is that despite your noble calling to the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ, necessity reduces you to a hustler. The pastor becomes the shill (promoter) for every Pink Tea, State Rally, Egg Roll, etc., and if you stress it right, certain folks will see to it that the pastor goes to the National Convention "right."

Now I am sure I am guilty of overstatement, but in a non-tithing church situation, with the demands of budget being what they are, much of the real power for ministry is diluted by different shades of the shenanigans described above. However, the greatest toll is on the preacher. Have you ever considered all the stress we absorb playing the games that surround the money question. Trying to stay cool, when some key church operative is about to upset the delicate money balance in the church's operation, has its emotional and psychological price. And losing your cool is costly when some unanticipated opposition stalls an important project that means much to the kingdom – and *the pastor's* vanity.

Now just suppose, all of that energy and skill and time were invested in launching a real stewardship program with Christ at the center instead of the minister, with Bible-based tithing as the methodology. Think what that would mean to your church of 100 or 200 or 500 or 1000 or 2000.





How Should This Sermon Influence My Christian Growth and Service?:

Special Points to Consider:

Our Response To Today's Message

As we are being challenged to be HEARERS and DOERS of the Word, we are being called to a serious response to each message/ sermon that we hear. The following pattern has been designed to encourage each of us to hear the WORD and LIVE IT!!!

First, READ

the sermon text slowly, meditatively and expectantly three times. Allow God's Word to be your primary focus. As you read, listen for God's message to His people both then and for you now. Ask yourself, "What truth is God calling me to learn and live out today?"(5 minutes)

Second, REFLECT

in the scripture. Record your observations. Note those things which stand out, pique your interest or make you wonder. Pay attention to the names of people, places, special events, sequences, repetition, patterns, etc. Note the use of verbs and verb tenses. (10 minutes)

Next, RETREAT

in prayer. Take two or three minutes to share your prayer concerns with God. Then devote the balance of your prayer time to silently and expectantly listening for God's words to you. Record both your prayers and God's response.

Finally, RESPOND

with action! God's answer to prayer almost always calls for a corresponding act on the part of those to whom God has given His Word. As the Lord addresses the prayers you have set before Him, ask yourself, "What is the one thing I will do in light of what I have discovered today?" Record this and commit to carrying it out today.
